The pyramids of Egypt are amazing. But Egypt isn't the only country with pyramids. There are pyramids in Mexico, too. The Sun Pyramid at Teotihuacan is huge and, like the pyramids in Egypt, nobody is quite sure how people built it. The Sun Pyramid is as high as a 20-storey* building and each side of its base* is 215 metres long. About 500,000 tourists climb the Sun Pyramid every year. There are also some pyramids in Greece. Most of them aren't as big as the ones in Egypt. And scientists aren't sure about them. Are the Greek pyramids natural or did people build them? One famous pyramid is the Pyramid of Hellenikon. Scientists say it isn't as old as the Egyptian pyramids. And it isn't as big - the sides of the base are between seven and nine metres long and it is only about three metres high! But you can go inside the Pyramid of Hellenikon. There is a large room inside. We don't know why people built the pyramid in Greece, but many think it was like a watchtower*. There are also pyramids in many other countries – China, Malaysia, Mexico and Peru, for example. The largest man-made pyramid in the world is in Mexico. The strange thing about the pyramids in different countries is that they all look similar. How did people in Mexico know how the people in Egypt made their pyramids? There are a lot of questions about pyramids and we still don't know all the answers. VOCABULARY


